

TRUE BLUE MOUNTAINS: RAINFOREST WATERFALLS AND WOODLANDS (KATOOMBA-LEURA)

This tour begins at the cliff edge in Leura and we walk down to the magical Fern Bower and the ancient world of Leura Forest. Listen for lyrebirds and learn about the significant part they play in shaping this ancient landscape. National Parks and Wildlife Service Discovery Rangers will discuss

LOCATION

Leura and Katoomba are townships on top of the southern escarpment of the upper Blue Mountains, with spectacular views across the Greater Blue Mountains World Heritage Area. Our century old walking track network takes unique advantage of an often challenging landscape of rainforests, deep gorges and vertical cliffs.

ACTIVITY PLAN

Groups arrive 15 to 30 minutes prior to start time for recess and toilets.

Discovery Rangers provide students with an introduction to the Blue Mountains environment, a safety briefing and hold a minimal impact discussion.


Students are divided into walking groups: group size of 15 with one group leader and one Discovery Ranger. (Group leaders not required for university groups.)

On the walk, students are encouraged to observe, question and discuss content that is relevant to your course of study and draw conclusions about the values of National Parks and reserve systems.

COST

GROUP SIZES

Minimum booking for group rates is 10 students and maximum is 90. Groups are to provide 1 teacher (or authorized adult) for every 15 students. (Supervising adults not required on university groups)

HOW TO GET THERE

Its easy to get to our tours:

You can catch a train from Sydney Central to Katoomba (2hrs) and walk 2.5 kilometres to the meeting place on Cliff Drive or catch the Explorer Bus or the Trolley Bus from Katoomba Station to Solitary Restaurant on Cliff Drive

By coach or car, drive west 100 kilometres from Sydney to Katoomba. Follow signs to Cliff Drive and continue. Our meeting place is the public car park adjacent Solitary Restuarant on Cliff Drive Katoomba.
