Site summary

Significant work has been conducted on implementing site actions. Partial implementation of actions is due to challenges posed by the nature of the species (it is clonal and it is fairly widely distributed in a localised area) and the nature of the site (encompasses multiple land uses and a high level of public access). Initial activity has focused upon investigating and assessing monitoring methods appropriate to the species and site and working with the land manager. Surveys have been undertaken and rapid monitoring methods piloted, with stratification to consider future hazard reduction burns. The methodology is to be refined and implemented in full.
