Summary of outcomes

The completion of the koala survey and habitat mapping project for the Richmond Valley Council will provided a basis for developing a Comprehensive Koala Plan of Management (CKPoM) for priority areas of the shire. Delivery of final draft CKPoMs for Ballina and Bellingen Councils are important milestones for koala conservation in these council areas. Lismore City Council's koala habitat restoration project and other on-ground works in progress under an agreement with Waggamba Landcare Group in the Moree-Gunnedah area have achieved significant on-ground outcomes for koala habitat on private lands. Research into the efficacy of koala management has also produced data that will inform future investment and policy decisions.

Total expenditure = \$177,000

Project objectives

- Reverse the decline of the koala in NSW koala populations in NSW are declining due to the impacts on habitat
- Loss, fire, dogs, cars, disease, drought and heat
- Ensure adequate protection, management and restoration of koala habitat
- Maintain healthy breeding populations of koalas throughout their current range.
