Meeting summary – Sydney, 12 November 2024

On 12 November Council held a joint meeting with regional advisory committee Chairs and a representative from the Karst Management Advisory Committee. Updates were provided on:

- The DCCEEW Strategic plan, opportunities, challenges and the importance of performance measures and monitoring.
- NSW Government's Plan for Nature and regional investment strategies.
- Programs that effectively use finite resources to manage the reserve system, including feral animal control, visitation, fire and ecosystem management, including the importance of community engagement across all programs.
- Aboriginal cultural heritage building capacity and capability.
- Park planning.
- Plans of management.
- Fire and incident operations.
- Assets of Intergenerational Significance Interpretations program.

NPWS briefings were then provided to Council for discussion and advice on leases and licences.
