

# Commercial Kangaroo Management Program Animal Welfare Report

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This Animal Welfare Report is to be completed and submitted by a licensee in accordance with Condition 14 of the Animal Dealer Licence.

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## Section A: General information

This condition requires a licensee who receives a kangaroo carcass containing a bullet wound in the body (affected carcass) to, among other things, complete and submit an Animal Welfare Report within 24 hours of receipt.

### Your obligations

- Complete a separate form for each affected carcass and submit it to the department.
- Keep the form so it may be produced to the department if requested.

Unless stated otherwise, words and expressions used in this Animal Welfare Report have the same meaning as those set out in the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* and the Animal Dealer Licence.

Condition 14 of the Animal Dealer (Kangaroo) Licence (Animal Dealer Licence) requires that the completed form be submitted within 24 hours of the Licensee receiving the affected carcass.

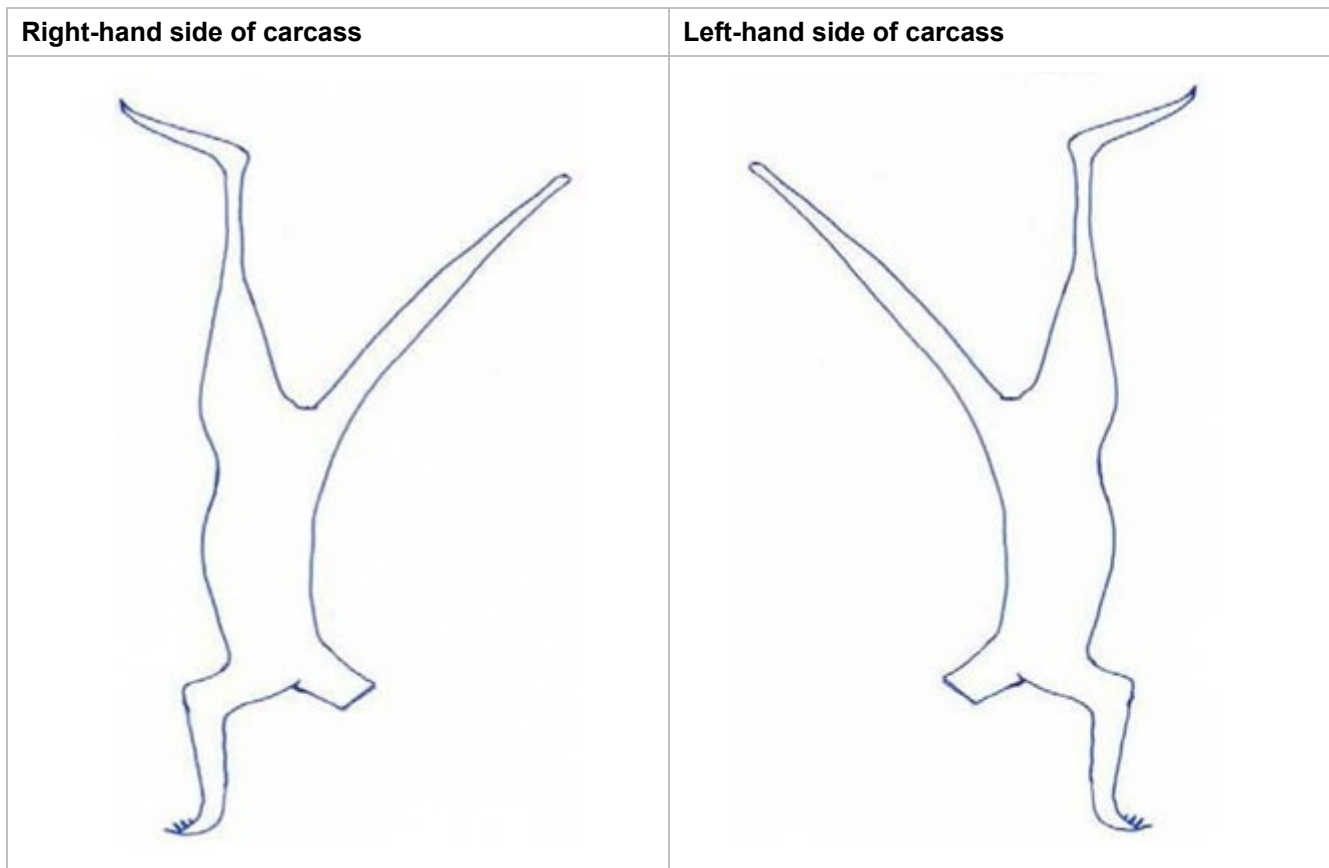
Photographic evidence must be clear and include the following:

- Photo of the affected carcass' carcass tag (general photos of the affected carcass as a whole and close-up of bullet wound).
- Photos showing a metal rod inserted in the bullet entry wound and out the bullet exit wound in the carcass to demonstrate the trajectory of the bullet through the carcass. The rod should not be forced through the carcass, but gently inserted.
- Photos showing all carcass bruising.
