



National Parks and Wildlife Advisory Council

Meeting summary – Broken Hill and West Darling area 23-24 May 2023

The National Parks and Wildlife Advisory Council (Council) provides the Minister for the Environment and the National Parks and Wildlife Services (NPWS) executive with independent, informed advice on the priorities, design, implementation and evaluation of NPWS policies, strategies and programs to help achieve the objects of the National Parks and Wildlife Act.

Council also plays a key advocacy role through engagement with stakeholder organisations and networks.

NPWS updates were provided to Council members for discussion on:

- the new NSW Government and its Ministry
- NPWS Aboriginal Joint Management program
- NSW Reconstruction Authority
- fire and incident management
- upcoming plans of management and planning status report.

Site Visit: Council visited Mutawintji National Park and Mutawintji Historic Site on Tuesday 23 May. The Chair of the Mutawintji National Park Board of Management, and a representative of the Mutawintji Local Aboriginal Land Council, briefed Council on:

- joint management principles
- Aboriginal history and cultural values
- programs and conservation efforts
- Aboriginal paintings, stencils and engravings on site which depict pre and post-colonial Aboriginal history and reflect the community's relationship to Country.
